Past Simple

We use the past simple to talk about an action that happened at a particular point in the past. We often use past time expressions (adverbs of time) such as: yesterday, last week, in month (in May)/ in season (in Winter) / in year (in 1999).

-The doctor examined me yesterday.

Subject + Verb (past) + Complement

Spelling Rules for Past Simple

Infinitive	Addition	Past simple
Most verbs, e.g. wait	+ -ed	Waited
Verbs ending in -e e.g. arrive	+ -d	Arrived
Verbs ending in consonant + -y e.g. try	-y → -I + -ed	Tried
Verbs ending in vowel + consonant e.g. stop	Double the consonant + - ed	Stopped

If the final consonant is -w, -x, -y e.g. delay		Delayed
---	--	---------

Many verbs have an irregular Past Simple form. These include:

Be	Was
Fall	Fell
Break	Broke
Go	Went
Have	Had
Take	Took

Past Continuous

Subject + was/ were + V.(ing) + complement

We use the past continuous to talk about an action that was happening in the background when another event happened. It is often used in a sentence with *when* + *past simple*.

For Example:

-He was getting off the bus when he slipped.

We can change the order of the sentence:

-He slipped when he was getting off the bus.

-He was getting off the bus, he slipped.

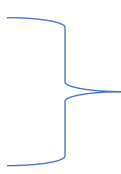
